Petula Clark is Britain's most successful solo recording artist of all time. Known for a series of movie appearances in the 1940s and 1950s, she scored a string of hit records before reaching the top spot in the UK charts in 1961 with *Sailor*. But her pop career was well and truly launched when *Downtown* – which she recorded in four languages – swept the world in 1964. Hits that followed included *My Love*, *I Couldn't Live Without Your Love*, *This is My Song* and *Don't Sleep in the Subway*.

A second stint in films resulted in Finian's *Rainbow*, *Goodbye Mr Chips* and *Never Never Land*, and she returned to the West End stage for *The Sound of Music*, *Blood Brothers* and *Sunset Boulevard*. Petula Clark continues to tour, singing to packed houses worldwide. The BBC Concert Orchestra salutes the legendary Petula Clark as she sings all her greatest hits and more, with special guests Michael Ball and Tony Hatch at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane.
